Top Priorities:

Ydalia's life mission is to use the social teachings of her faith to transform her local, state, national, and global community. She is running for the Idaho Senate to help protect all Idahoans' quality of life. Three issues that are important to her are the economy, human rights, and environmental justice.

Ms. Yado believes that all vocations are essential to society. She believes that to boost Idaho's economy, Idaho needs to invest in both college preparation courses and professional technical education opportunities. Idaho public schools are already creating tracks that motivate students to pursue the career of their choice. If Idaho properly funds education and workforce development training now, she knows Idahoans will have a better future.

Ydalia believes that all Idahoans deserve to have economic security. The equitable payment of taxes is a patriotic act that helps stimulate our economy by distributing resources to individuals and communities in need; hence, creating prosperity for all!To improve Idaho's economy, Idaho legislators need to establish a living wage. According to the Congressional Budget Office (CBO), Medicaid expansion would add very little to the costs states would have spent on Medicaid without The Affordable Care Act. CBO claims that Medicaid Expansion would decrease the spending the state would spend on "uncompensated care and other services they provide to the uninsured." From 2014-2022, the federal government claimed they would pick up 93% of the cost to expand Medicaid. They had also agreed to cover 100 % of newly eligible Medicaid recipients from 2014-2016, an opportunity Idaho did not seize. Further, the CBO stated that the federal government agreed to pay no less than 90% on a permanent basis. All Idahoans deserve affordable access to health care. The State of Idaho needs to work with the federal government to protect all citizens. Idahoans contribute to federal taxes, Ydalia believes the state should allow the federal government to contribute to those who need help by choosing to expand Medicaid.

To remain healthy and prosperous, the Legislature must protect Idaho's air, water, and land. If elected, Ydalia will work to give local communities control of their environment and help them protect their constituents from special interests. Idaho cannot continue to allow big oil companies to infringe on property owners' rights.

Ydalia believes it only takes a spark to ignite a fire that can illuminate the world, and she wants to be that spark here in Idaho. She encourages all those who can vote to seize their opportunity to illuminate Idaho with integrity by voting Yado for Idaho in 2016.
